

## Dear colleagues,

This is the **first** circular of the 4-th International Conference on **Current Problems in Nuclear Physics and Atomic Energy (NPAE-Kyiv2012),** which will be held from September 10 to September 14, 2012 in Kyiv, Ukraine. This conference is the continuation of the conferences held in Kyiv in 2006, 2008 and 2010.

The NPAE-Kyiv2012 conference will cover the following topics:

- Collective processes in atomic nuclei
- Nuclear reactions
- Nuclear structure and decay processes
- Rare nuclear processes
- Neutron and reactor physics, nuclear data
- Problems of atomic energy
- Applied nuclear physics, experimental facilities and detection techniques
- High-energy physics

The conference will consist of plenary, parallel and poster sessions. Plenary sessions are composed of invited talks, and parallel sessions consist of invited talks and oral presentations selected from the contributions.

The working language of the Conference is English.

Authors are invited to submit one page abstract (around 300-500 words) by June 1, 2012 via e-mail to <u>npae-kyiv2012@kinr.kiev.ua</u>. The abstracts will be issued before the Conference. The rules for abstract preparation will be provided in the second circular.

## Accommodation

Conference participants can lodge in the hotel complex of the IPE in the singleand double rooms of European standards. The Conference sessions will be held at the same building. Meals (breakfast and/or lunch) will be organized at the IPE upon request (charged extra). A number of luxury hotels will also be available with assistance of the Organizing Committee upon request.
